ADVENT WREATH LIGHTING

The Candle of Hope: The Patriarchs, Abraham, the Old Testament Ancestors of Jesus

Reader Today we observe the First Sunday of Advent and we light the candle of Hope. We remember the Patriarchs of our faith and celebrate the hope we have in Jesus Christ.

God told Abraham that all the nations of the world would be blessed through him, because he trusted and put his hope in God. The Old Testament spoke of the coming of Christ, of how a Savior would be born, a king in the line of King David. He would rule the world wisely and bless all the nations.

Here a person lights the First (purple) Candle.

Hope is like a light shining in a dark place. As we look at the light of this candle we celebrate the hope we have in Jesus Christ.

God of Abraham and Sarah and all the Patriarchs and Matriarchs of old, you are our God too. Your love is revealed to us in Jesus Christ, Son of God, and Son of David. Help us in preparing to celebrate his birth, to make our hearts ready and to place our hope in you. 




